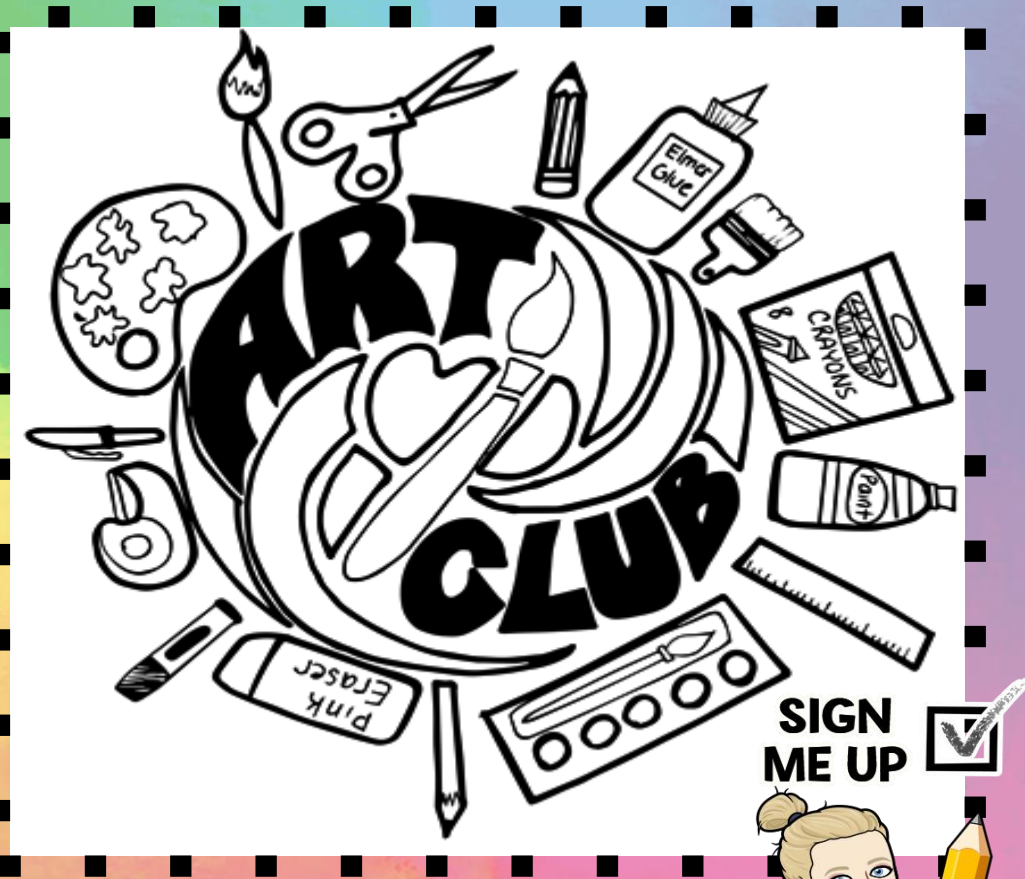

ART CLUB

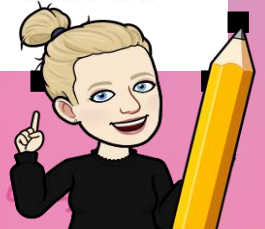

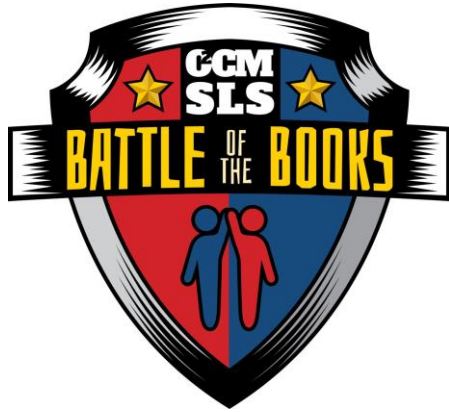
Every Wednesday 3:00-4:00
